



## Wit & Wisdom Opt-Out Form

Only YOU can make the decision about what book(s) you are comfortable with your child reading. Before submitting your opt-out to the school, make sure you review the <u>analysis</u> of the Wit & Wisdom books to understand what the specific concerns are, and **ONLY opt out of the books that you do not want taught to your child.** 

## Using the letter/form:

- 1) Be sure to date your letter
- 2) Provide your email address in the letter so the school can follow up with you
- 3) Include your child's name, grade, teacher (if known), and school
- 4) Delete the grades/books that DO NOT apply to your child
- 5) Sign, Print, Date to complete

This is meant as a guide to help you opt-out of harmful curriculum. Should you want to make any changes, please do so as required to suit your needs.

## Reference: Law's and Policies to know and site if necessary.

T.C.A. § 49-6-7003. A parent or legal guardian is entitled to review all teaching materials, instructional materials, and other teaching aids used in the classroom of the parent or legal guardian's child; and to review tests that are developed by and graded by a teacher of the parent or legal guardian's child. LEAs shall make all teaching materials, including handouts readily available for review upon request by the parents or legal guardians.

Chapter 493 of the Public Acts of 2021, now codified in Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-6-1019, prohibits certain concepts from being included or promoted as part of a course of instruction, in curriculum, or included in supplemental instructional materials used by public schools in Tennessee
