



With that being said, I apologize for the delay in my response; however, I did not want to reply to your scripted email with another scripted email. I wanted to read all books and materials for 2<sup>nd</sup> grade so I could form my own opinion of this curriculum. I also attended an event on Wit and Wisdom which went through all books, supplemental material and teachers' manuals for each grade level.

The entire curriculum for elementary has a dark, feelings-based overtone that is emotionally driven. It talks of infidelity, suicide, anti-police, anti-American, injustice, protest and racism. Where are the pro-country, pro-helping our neighbors, happy books for 7–10-year-olds that encourage them to be better individuals?

Wit & Wisdom violates Anti-CRT legislation HB0580/SB623 in the following ways:

- Cannot demonstrate one race or sex is inherently superior to another race or sex (Separate is Never Equal page 18-19)
  - An individual should not feel discomfort, guilt, anguish, or another form of psychological distress solely because of the individual's race or sex (Separate is Never Equal page 14-15)
  - Cannot show that this state or the United States is fundamentally or irredeemably racist or sexist (Ruby Bridges Goes to School page 2)
  - Promoting division between, or resentment of, a race, sex, religion, creed, nonviolent political affiliation, social class, or class of people. (All books mentioned below.)
- (These are just examples of how the law is being violated on the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade level. The attached google slide has more examples.)

#### Ruby Bridges Goes to School

Page 2 - My son will be taught the N word. We don't speak like that in our home, and I am disgusted at the fact he will learn that from his 2<sup>nd</sup> grade teacher. (Illustration attached)

Page 24-25 - Shows the N word on a wall and the teachers manual instructs the teacher to "point out the N word and talk to them about racial slurs". Repeatedly instructs the teacher to talk to them about this and hates speech. At 7 years old. (Illustration attached)

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Page 61 google slide - Angry white people... the crowd wanted to kill her

It never speaks of the Civil Rights Act or the progress our country has made, and instead compares whites to the Romans that crucified Jesus.

Teachers Manual wants kids to role play from a page in this book! All pages speak of "angry white people" yelling at a young black girl. Again, this is disgusting that you want children to act this out.

#### Martin Luther King and the March on Washington

Teacher Handout (page 122 google slide)- There are white firemen violently hosing down black people against a light pole. (Illustration attached) The entire tone of this book pushes the whites vs blacks narrative. This is too much for a 2<sup>nd</sup> grade level. What MLK did is amazing and there are many great books out there that are more on a general level for 2<sup>nd</sup> graders without this verbiage or graphic pictures. This is anti-white and anti-police. Teacher handout states "they met hate every day from the all-white police force".

#### Separate is Never Equal

Page 26 – "Mexicans need to learn cleanliness of minds, manners and dress. They are not learning that at home. They have problems with lice, impetigo and tuberculosis. They have generally dirty hands, face, neck and ears. Mexicans are inferior to whites in personal hygiene". None of the statements are denounced later in the book.

How do you think the Mexican kids at school are going to feel? Embarrassed? Full of shame?

Proponents of Wit and Wisdom say this curriculum helps raise students lexile rating, yet in the teacher's manual it states the reading level for this book is too hard so the book must be read to the class. Instead, the teacher is instructed to tell them to study the "rich illustrations". (page 117 of google slide)

The illustrations in this book are **despicable!**

Page 14-15 - Shows Mexican kids having to eat in a cow pasture, with flies swarming around, surrounded by an electric fence (illustration attached)

Page 18-19 - A sign reads "No dogs or Mexicans allowed in pool" Then shows Mexican kids behind bars watching the white kids' swim. (Illustration attached)

Attached is a google slide which shows the books I have mentioned above, and also includes:

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- Examples of how 2<sup>nd</sup> graders from day 1 are being taught about injustice and protest
- Exerts from books, teacher's manuals and supplemental material for grades 3-5 that are not suitable for 8-10 year old children.
- Wit and Wisdom reviews showing that it failed the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> review and was simply pushed through on a state level. (starts on page 141 of google slide)
- Shows how Wilco schools received "free supplemental materials" in exchange for passing the Wit and Wisdom curriculum. (page 155 of google slide)

SUBJECT: Request for Reconsideration of Instructional Materials

Dear Chris Schwartz,

Hope you are having a wonderful, relaxing summer! All of the teachers and administrators had such a tough year you definitely deserve a long break. I want to also add that we thoroughly enjoyed Ms. Eilermann this past year. She was truly made to be a teacher. Nash loved being in her room and always spoke so highly of her. We love Creekside and feel so lucky to be there with you and the rest of the amazing staff.

I have been learning a lot about the Great Minds Wit & Wisdom curriculum and am obviously very concerned with this curriculum since Nash will be in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. I'm sure you have heard that this curriculum has been a topic of much discussion over the past several months due to its dark content, age inappropriateness, and racially charged instruction. As an example I request you review a WCS parent testimony at the Moms for Liberty CRT101 Event (Attachment 2), minute 39:30. Additional concerns have been shared on Instagram @Dr\_Mr.Golden.

Per Williamson County Board of Education Policy 4.403, dated 6 April 2019, I am formally requesting a "Reconsideration of Instructional Materials," to include the Wit and Wisdom curriculum, the supplemental use of Brain Pop, and the library's GALE database. I further request an exception to policy, as stated below.

4.403, if followed to the letter will not yield a timely result before the coming 2021-2022 school year. Furthermore, the Board of Education addressed the Great Minds Wit & Wisdom curriculum at their 13 May 2021 work session (Attachment 1). At minute 3:01:00, Nancy Garrett (District 12) suggested that a curriculum review, to include "teacher inputs, student inputs, and community inputs," should be reported on at the June board meeting. Superintendent Golden responded, "Yes ma'am, I think that's a great idea." Jay Galbreath (District 6) suggested "solicitation of feedback" at 3:18:53. Since 4.403 could easily exceed 30 working days, by its own admission, I request the following exception to policy.

Exception to Policy: Since multiple principals are receiving this same request and because the issue is already up for review at the county level, it is my recommendation and my request that this issue be immediately elevated to the WCS Board of Education and Superintendent of Schools, so that multiple schools may simultaneously review the material in a timely manner so that a decision may be reached in time for the 2021-2022 school year.

I submit 15 June 2021, 10:00 am, at the auditorium in the WCS Central Office, or a WCS gymnasium, for this review to take place. Parents across the county are prepared to make a centralized presentation on this matter. This format will not exceed 90 minutes. I, and parents like me, simply wish to be heard ahead of the 17 June Board of Education work session and 21 June board meeting when the Wit and Wisdom results will be discussed.

REASONS TO NOT EXTEND JASON GOLDEN'S CONTRACT in JUNE 2021

1. He received less than exceptional ratings by the Board of Education members last May. On a rating scale of 1 to 5 for Performance Goals 1 through 4, he failed to get a 4 (averaged) in a single category. His Overall average was 3.41, and
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he failed to get a 4 (averaged) in a single category. His Overall average was 3.41, and his lowest averaged score, 2.86, was given for Performance Goal 2: "Communication with Stakeholders."

2. What's the rush? Contract extensions are usually given to incentivize and secure a high-performing superintendent to stay with a school district. Given his less-than-stellar reviews by the BOE, Jason Golden does not fall into that "high performing" category. Why not wait a year to extend his contract? That would give him time and incentive to bring up his scores and merit an extension. His contract does not expire until 2023. There is no reason to rush.

3. Jason Golden has been caught in no less than three lies. 1) He denied the teaching of Critical Race Theory in schools, and 2) further denied that it was on the table with Fostering Healthy Solutions. 3) He denied that money was involved as an incentive to adopt the Wit & Wisdom curriculum. 4) He denied that he was invited to the recent "Let's Talk Wit & Wisdom" event, presented by Moms for Liberty (MFL) Williamson County.

- a. MFL has proven that tenets of CRT do exist in the Great Minds Wit & Wisdom curriculum in Grade 2, Module 3.
- b. Fostering Healthy Solutions has stated both in their contract (listed in the "Exhibit A" addendum to their contract with WCS) and in their March 4th video session with Jason Golden and the BOE, that their mission is "Diversity, Equity and Inclusion" within Williamson County Schools. It is well documented that these words are another descriptor of CRT.
- c. Money was an incentive to adopt the Wit & Wisdom curriculum. Why did WCS proceed through 3 months of procedural textbook review, only to consider and adopt Wit & Wisdom in the last two weeks after 1 day of teacher review and 1 day of public review, where no actual books were present? The waiver request for WCS specifically cites the [free] TDOE supplemental materials as reason for adopting Wit & Wisdom. This is estimated to represent a \$1.5M savings. Additionally, the TDOE promised WCS \$16-\$18 per pupil for adopting Wit & Wisdom.
- d. In response to the 13 May 2021 work session in which Jason Golden and the BOE agreed to conduct a review of the Wit & Wisdom curriculum, involving the "solicitation of parent, teacher, and student feedback," MFL requested a forum in which to present our findings, the culmination of over 1200 hours of research by more than 15 parents. Jason Golden repeatedly denied this request. MFL then created the event "Let's Talk Wit & Wisdom," modeled off the previously held WCS "Let's Talk Schools" quarterly forums. MFL repeatedly requested Jason Golden's presence, as well as the BOE, commissioners and local elected officials, at this event. However, when asked by a county commissioner at the June 14th Board of Commissioners Meeting if he would be attending "Let's Talk Wit & Wisdom," Mr. Golden replied, "I was not invited." He clearly forgot that every single BOE member and commissioner were CC'd on his multiple invitations
- e. These examples have created a trust issue between Mr. Golden and the community he serves. There is no room for trust issues in the Superintendent of Schools position. Let him show his integrity and honesty in the coming 2021-2022 year and earn back the trust of the community before he receives another contract extension

4. Jason Golden has a history of selectively listening to left-leaning parent organizations. The "Let's Talk Wit & Wisdom," "CRT101," and the WCRP Mix and Mingle are the most recent events to which he was invited, but did not show. Two of these events specifically addressed front-and-center issues in WCS, and one featured him as the guest of honor. Jason Golden was a no-show to each one. However, he is documented giving special access and consideration to left-leaning groups such as, One Willco, FEJC, WSJA, and Williamson Strong. Undoubtedly, this contributed to his poor ratings in Performance Category 2: "Communication with Stakeholders." He should be open and accessible to all parent and community organizations.

5. Jason Golden has repeatedly shown a lack of concern towards the well-being of individual students and families.

- a. He never expressed concern or took material action to address the concerns outlined in the Dixon letter last March, in which the emotional traumatization of a 2nd grade biracial child by the Wit & Wisdom curriculum was detailed.
- b. He rebuffed the "M Family" in their letter detailing the emotional traumatization of their 1st grade child by the Wit & Wisdom curriculum. That child is in therapy as a result of instruction received in a WCS Elementary School.
- c. Mr. Golden has expressed zero concern for the children mentioned in verified parental testimonies at Instagram @Dear\_Mr.Golden.
