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Hello, Principal Schwartz.

Had it not been for the draconian COVID policies implemented across WCS in the 2020-2021 school year, my daughter would have been a Creekside Otter. Instead, I "followed the science" and determined it was neither necessary nor humane to mask a child for 7 hours a day, 5 days a week. And so I withdrew her last July and put her in a private school. (Incidentally, we have had zero COVID issues for the entirety of the school year.)

One might call that Providence, because it was only in the last 3 months that I became astutely aware of the curriculum being taught to Creekside children in the form of "Wit and Wisdom." I am further aware of two first graders in your school that have suffered emotional trauma as a result of this curriculum (at least one is in therapy in an attempt to undo the damage that has been done). Apart from the unconscionable effects on kids, elements of this curriculum also clearly violate the newly signed HB0580/SB0623 "Anti-CRT" legislation.

There is no chance that I would insert my up-and-coming first grader into that kind of environment. It would be emotionally traumatic for me as her mother to see her off at the school bus stop everyday, knowing that loss of innocence and age-inappropriate content are awaiting her in the classroom. And so she will remain on higher ground in a private school until such time that WCS can prove it teaches safe curriculum in an environment free from activism, agenda, and ideology. Reading, writing, and arithmetic, please. Leave the parenting and the values to me.

And so I write this as a concerned citizen. Even if I raise my daughter all the way through 12th grade in a

private school setting, she will be a critical and free thinker in a sea of stunted minds that never had a chance because their entire K-12 experience was "social emotional learning," steeped in ideology and activism, rather than reason, logic, and rational thought. That is not the society I wish my children to inherit. Furthermore, it breaks my heart to hear stories from other parents whose children have been traumatized. I look at my own children and shudder to think how it would affect our family if it happened to us.

I realize that you have a canned response ready to go in answer to this email. I wonder that you don't feel a tad ashamed to answer genuine parent requests and testimonies with a canned response handed to you from on high. That does little to foster trust and build relationships within the community which your school serves. And yes, you are in service to the community. It's a shame you and those above you are so resistant to hearing from it. I would like to extend a heartfelt invitation for you to attend our community presentation on our findings regarding Wit and Wisdom on the 15th of June at 10 o'clock in the morning.

If you cannot make a gesture of good faith to grant us a forum, why should I respond in good faith to hand over a 1000 hours of work by dedicated parents? Additionally, the work is not complete; nine teachers manuals are still outstanding. The analysis will be complete by 15 June, at which time we will make it available to all.

It should be quite clear to all in receipt of this email that the issues with Wit and Wisdom are bigger than an individual principal. It's bigger than "3 or 4 of us" meeting with Mr. Golden at his office, because we know that is where the information will die a quick death. It's time to shine some light. Parents must be, and will be, heard. We have repeatedly requested a forum in which to present our findings on the 15th of June at 10 o'clock in the morning. Dave Allen will present the findings from his review of Wit and Wisdom at the 17 June BOE Work Session. Do you really presume to accept these findings when thirty-two 4.403 requests are left sitting on the table? Are you so bold to presume that your Board Members, whom you serve, will accept that, as well?

I would also like to point out that my personal email to Principal Chris Schwartz, sent Friday at 2:21 pm, was "leaked" to Williamson Strong by 7 pm that night. Everyone in receipt of my email (everyone currently CC'd) was an elected official; I never shared it to social media. Shame on the elected official who cannot be trusted. That will be brought to light, as well.

In the interim, I request that everyone in receipt of this email, especially Williamson County Board of Education members, please mark your calendars for June 15th, at 10 o'clock in the morning. I personally guarantee this presentation will not be a waste of your time. I will send a follow up with location and pertinent details.

Ms. Steenman,

I was glad we were able to speak Friday night as well. It gave me some insight into why you were asking for a forum, in large part that you don't want to keep on having individual meetings with Board members to share your concerns. First, as we mentioned to the Board at our May Work Session, our instructional staff has been reviewing how things went this first year with Wit and Wisdom, including the reading selections. I do encourage you to forward to us as soon as you are ready the excerpts from the books that have concerned you or members of your group, and they'll compare those to their review.

Second, and more important to answer your request for a forum, our Board Policies give a mechanism to address your concern and why you are asking for this forum. Our Board has addressed your specific concern especially through Board Policy 4.403, [Reconsideration of Instructional Materials and Textbooks](#), at this URL: [4403.docx - Microsoft Word Online \(live.com\)](#). In short, this policy creates a review committee when a concern such as yours is brought. That's the process that it seems you need to initiate, based on what you shared with me Friday evening. It's my understanding that you are asking for Wit and Wisdom to be eliminated at all our schools and you don't have a child in WCS right now, so if you do submit a Request for Reconsideration of Instructional Materials, we'll take into consideration that this is not an individual school question for your child as we establish the committee; any citizen can request we reconsider instructional materials through this Board-established process.

You also let me know that your organization has only existed for seven weeks, and you're trying to learn so many processes at once. Given that you asked to speak at the County Commission's Education Committee meeting but their agenda is generally limited to reviewing finance issues, I know that it can be tough to learn how the State has separated responsibilities. Again, with your concern, Board Policy 4.403 is the route that will get you and the Moms for Liberty an answer on your concerns about Wit and Wisdom. I'll make sure our staff sends you the reconsideration form mentioned in the policy.

Thanks for your email on behalf of Moms for Liberty. We have received the same email content from different people on behalf of that group, so I wanted to make sure I responded to each of you and re-share a few items that we've discussed at our Board meetings the past few weeks.

Wit and Wisdom is our adopted English Language Arts (ELA) curriculum for grades K-5 through the State's required curriculum adoption process. For grades K-2, we included a Foundational Literacy (phonics) program in addition to Wit and Wisdom. This curriculum was reviewed and selected by teachers and a stakeholder review committee then adopted by the School Board following the review process that is in Tennessee State law and established in School Board policy. Board policies and the law that guide this process are TCA 49-6-2207 and Board Policy 4.401, **Textbook Selection Adoption** and 4.402, **Selection of Instructional Materials**. WCS will continue to make decisions based on what's best for our students locally, not based on a national agenda. We have heard concerns that some of our families have experienced critical race theory promoted in other parts of the country. We do not have in our instructional plans promotion of critical race theory. We also know that the Tennessee Legislature recently passed HB580/SB623 addressing many concepts that public schools should not promote, and we are committed to honoring all Tennessee laws that our elected officials enact. The detail of that particular bill can be found at <https://www.capitol.tn.gov/Bills/112/Amend/HA0441.pdf>.

During this first year of implementation of the new ELA adoption, the district's curriculum specialists have been making modifications to the content and material based

Dear Mr. Golden,

We the people of Williamson County have a reasonable request to make to be allowed to participate in the Wit & Wisdom evaluation.

The 13 May 2021 Williamson County School (WCS) Board Work Session (Attachment 1) addressed, among other things, the Great Minds Wit & Wisdom curriculum, adopted by WCS on 30 March 2020.
