Gregg and Chad,

Thank you for representing the people of District 4 on the County Commission. It has been an honor to serve on the WCS Board of Education representing District 4. WCS is and has been a leader in educational excellence throughout the state. Our students and staff are always striving for excellence in academics, the arts, and athletics.

I am writing to let you know of my intentions to leave my duties as an elected Board member on September 30, 2021. My family and I will be leaving Williamson County and Tennessee as we will be moving to Virginia the first week of October.

As you are aware, these last 18 months have been a challenging time for all in our community; however, my colleagues and I have worked tirelessly alongside Mr. Golden and the outstanding staff to ensure that WCS continues to offer a safe, healthy, and high achieving environment for all students. I am proud of how the board made necessary decisions during the 2020-2021
