Mr. Golden,

I am a 24 year resident of Brentwood. My three sons attended Brentwood public schools and my wife (late 90s, early 2000s) was the president of the Brentwood HS PTO. We are big supporters of public schools, and we moved to Brentwood because of its public schools. I can't say enough about the great education my sons received in your schools.

I am a retired IT executive (retired two years ago as the CIO of The General Insurance). During my working years, I was heavily involved in all things Metro Schools education including being board chair of Alignment Nashville (support MNPS via alignment with community organizations), one of the original partnership council chairs for the Academies of Nashville and chair of the workforce development and education committee of the Greater

Nashville Technology Council. When I retired, I sought out additional opportunities to be engaged in public education activities and particularly education transformation initiatives. That desire connected me with NOAH (Nashville Organized for Action and Hope). NOAH's primary mission is to eliminate systemic racism anywhere it exists. We accomplish our mission via several committees that create change by influencing public policy. One of those committees is the Education Task Force of which I am a member.

Sorry for the long introduction, but I felt you needed to understand my background before telling you why I'm contacting you. Our task force is very engaged in doing whatever we can to influence the outcome of the governor's public education funding review. We see the review as an opportunity to enact change in the state's public education funding that is long overdue. We applaud the governor making funding reform a top of mind initiative, and we want to make sure that issues related to equity and overall funding are addressed.

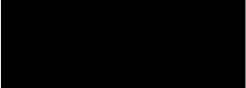
