There are 26 thus far this week alone in the 6th grade. That's just shy of 10% of the class.

As a school, the attendance is in the 83.3-84.8% range.

I'm uncertain how granular you get to see the #'s...but these are shocking.

6th graders are largely under the age of 12, unprotected by the mask mandate.  
Please, I implore you, bring to vote tonight an expansion of the current mask mandate to include all K-12; if that fails, please suggest one for K-8.

Good Morning Nancy -

I sent the note below to Dr. Boyd at Woodland Middle; do you have any data on actual absentee rates (not just the reported positive cases) and greater clarity on the daily COVID counts at WMS?

As I mentioned with the data I sent yesterday, I strongly believe the #'s are grossly underestimating the actual reality of COVID cases as parents keep their kids home without reporting positive tests. The rabid anti-maskers will do anything they can to obscure the truth.

Many emails were circulating in the parent community last night that the average wait to get a COVID test taken is in the 3-5 hour range...if at all possible. That doesn't count time to get the result...that's just to get in somewhere to get a test.

I hope this email finds you well. While I've enjoyed the dramatically shorter car line this week, it has been really disconcerting. My son was telling me he's seeing up to 10 out of 30 missing from his band class, for example.

We received the same text/email from you 3 consecutive days this week regarding new COVID cases at WMS (and thank you, we appreciate any/all communications):

" This communication is to inform you and your family that there have reported COVID cases in the 6th, 7th, and 8th grades at Woodland Middle School on Wednesday, August 25th. The reports have not been verified as a positive COVID cases by the health department, but we wanted you to be aware. "

Leads to 2 questions:

1. Is it possible for you to tell me how many cases you've had in each of the 6th, 7th and 8th grades this week? The email message is ambiguous.
2. Can you share the absentee rates by grade this week?
