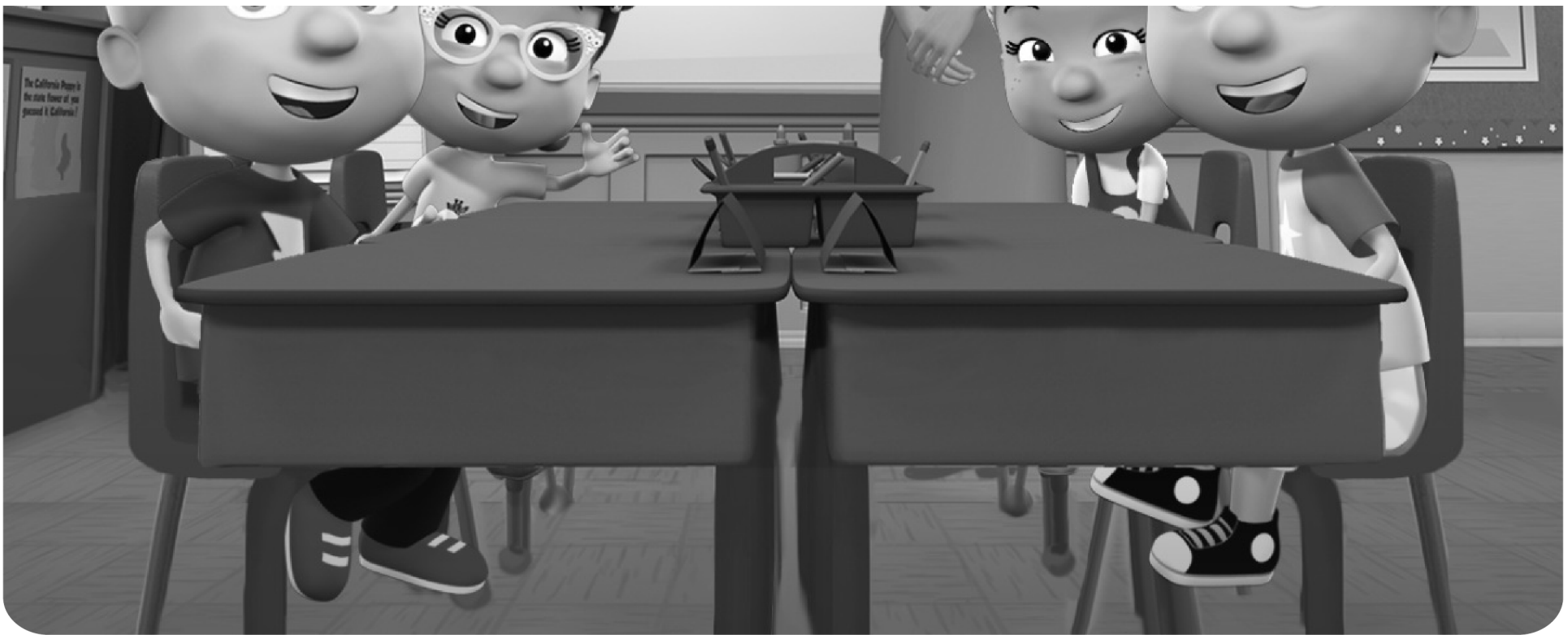

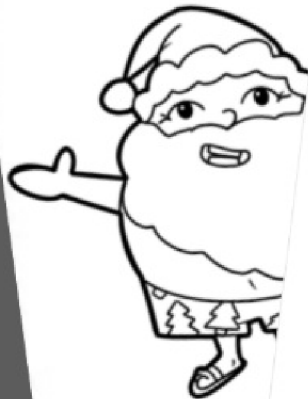

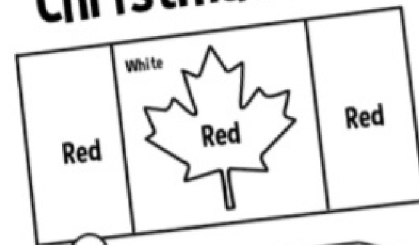
Children write letters to Santa but instead of sending them by the mail, English children put the letters and Santa Claus in a box and burn the smoke.

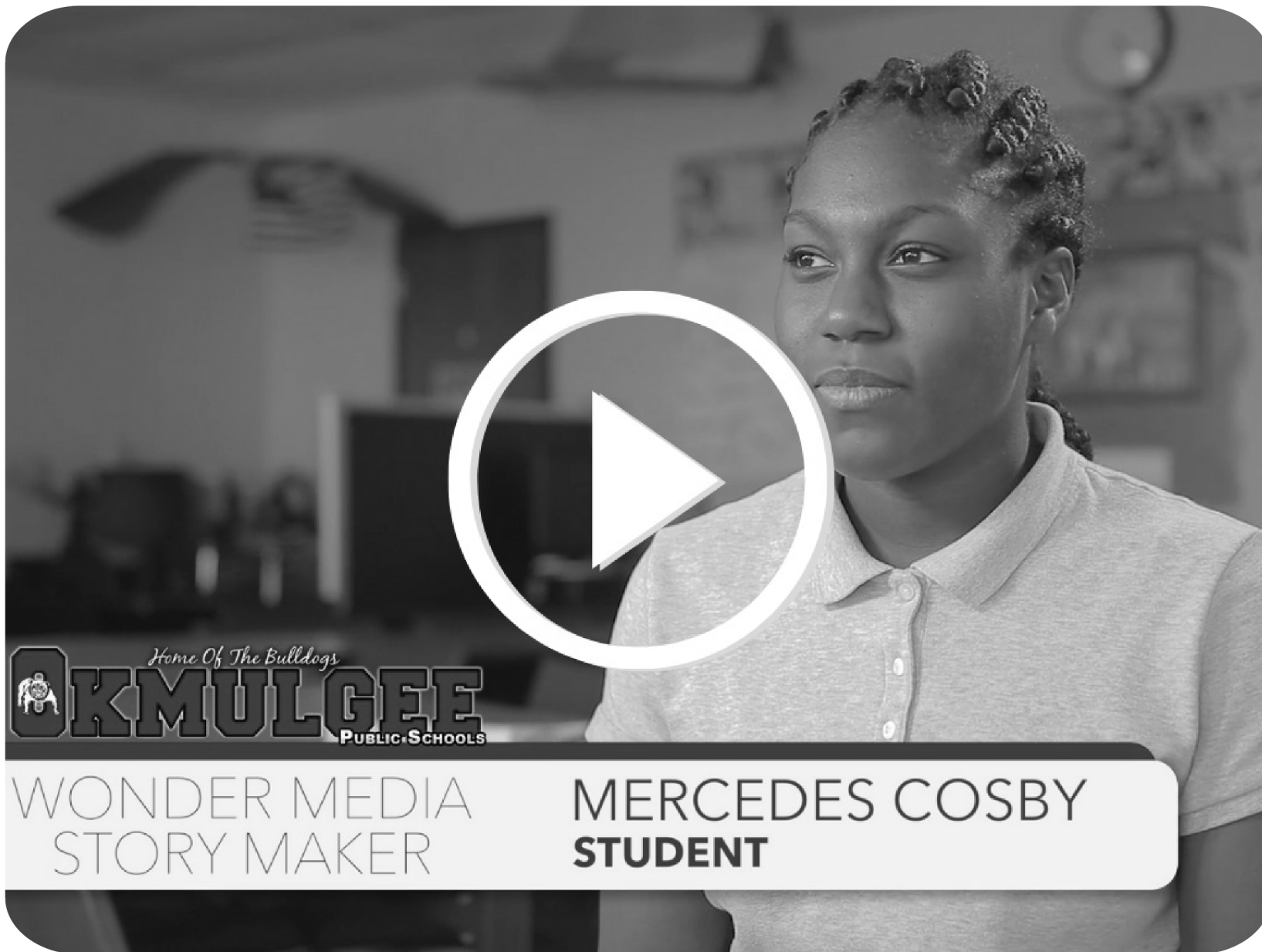
